PLEASE READ BEFORE SIGNING UP FOR A TRIP

BUS TRIP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- **SIGN-UP DAY:** The first Monday of each month, 9:00 to 10:30. You may sign up for three (3) trips only on sign-up day. You can come back the next day to sign up for more trips, if available. You may sign up yourself and one (1) additional member, **who is not present at sign-up, and you must pay for both.** If the first Monday is a holiday, sign-up day will be on Tuesday.
 - **PAYING FOR TRIPS:** You must pay for trips when signing up. If you sign up for a trip and you do not pay, your name will be removed from the trip list.
 - **WAITLIST:** Sign up on the waitlist if the regular list is full. If there is a cancellation, you will be notified. Do not pay for the trip until you are confirmed by the trip coordinator.
 - **CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS:** **If you must cancel a trip, call the Trip Coordinator.** **All bus fares are non-refundable.** Refunds for tickets/admission **only** will be given if we are able to fill your seat. Unless you give us at least 48-hour notice, we cannot attempt to fill your seat. If you cancel due to illness, injury, or funeral, you may qualify for a refund (minus bus fare). Refunds must be claimed within 3-months. Outstanding refunds will be donated to PSC Bus Trip fund. **DO NOT CALL THE FRONT OFFICE!**
 - **THREE-STRIKES RULE:** If you cancel 3 trips within a **3-month period**, you will not be allowed to participate in bus trips for the next 3 months. After 3 months, you may sign up for a trip, however if you cancel or 'no show' again within a 3-month period, another 3-month restriction begins. (Illnesses, injuries, and funerals may be excused and exempt from this rule). 'No shows' are considered cancellations.
 - **PARTICIPANTS:** Participants **must be self-sufficient with no mobility issues** to go on our bus trips. Trip coordinators, drivers, and other participants are not there to assist. Please take note of where the trip is going. If it requires lots of walking, the ability to move fast, or has unstable terrain, **please do not sign up.** You may bring your own caregiver, however they must sign-up and pay for the trip. We reserve the **right to refuse** participation if we observe mobility, fall risk, safety, or hygiene issues.
 - **DAY OF EVENT:** Please arrive 15-minutes before departure time. The bus leaves promptly on time and will not wait for you.
 - **HANDICAP:** We only accept the WC19 compliant wheelchairs. Bus drivers and trip coordinators are **not** trained to assist (you must bring a caregiver). Caregivers do not have

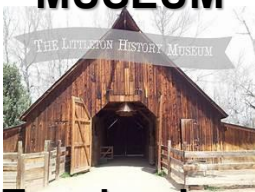
